THE INTROIT


Having received the Lord's forgiveness, we are glad to enter into His courts with praise and thanksgiving.

The Old Testament Reading:

Isaiah 55:10-11 "For as the rain comes down, and the snow from heaven, And do not return there, But water the earth, And make it bring forth and bud, That it may give seed to the sower And bread to the eater, 11 So shall My word be that goes forth from My mouth; It shall not return to Me void, But it shall accomplish what I please, And it shall prosper in the thing for which I sent it.

PASTOR Here ends the Old Testament reading. We continue with the responsive reading of:

THE GRADUAL

The Gradual is a "Bridge of praise" that links the Old Testament with the New Testament.

PASTOR The Epistle Reading comes from Romans chapter 8, beginning there in the 18th verse.




The Epistle Reading:

Romans 8:18-25 For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us. 19 For the earnest expectation of the creation eagerly waits for the revealing of the sons of

God. 20 For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of Him who subjected it in hope; 21 because the creation itself also will be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God. 22 For we know that the whole creation groans and labors with birth pangs together until now. 23 Not only that, but we also who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, eagerly waiting for the adoption, the redemption of our body. 24 For we were saved in this hope, but hope that is seen is not hope; for why does one still hope for what he sees? 25 But if we hope for what we do not see, we eagerly wait for it with perseverance.

PASTOR Here ends the Epistle Reading.

P: Blessed are they who hear the Word of God and keep it.

THE SERMON


Matthew 13:1-23 On the same day Jesus went out of the house and sat by the sea. 2 And great multitudes were gathered together to Him, so that He got into a boat and sat; and the whole multitude stood on the shore. 3 Then He spoke many things to them in parables, saying: "Behold, a sower went out to sow. 4 "And as he sowed, some seed fell by the wayside; and the birds came and devoured them, 5 "Some fell on stony places, where they did not have much earth; and they immediately sprang up because they had no depth of earth. 6 "But when the sun was up they were scorched, and because they had no root they withered away. 7 "And some fell among thorns, and the thorns sprang up and choked them. 8 "But others fell on good ground and vielded a crop: some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. 18 "Therefore hear the parable of the sower: 19 "When anyone hears the word of the kingdom, and does not understand it, then the wicked one comes and snatches away what was sown in his heart. This is he who received seed by the wayside. 20 "But he who received the seed on stony places, this is he who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy; 21 "yet he has no root in himself, but endures only for a while. For when tribulation or persecution arises because of the word, immediately he stumbles. 22 "Now he who received seed among the thorns is he who hears the word, and the cares of this world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and he becomes unfruitful. 23 "But he who received seed on the good ground is he who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and produces: some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty."







A Note To Our Visitors: According to God's Word, partaking of the Lord's Supper with other Christians implies a oneness and unity of faith and belief. God wants us to be like-minded in our beliefs before we enter into fellowship such as Holy Communion. (1 Corinthians 1:10 and 1 Corinthians 10:17). Therefore, if you have not publicly declared your agreement with the teachings of this Christian congregation through formal membership, we ask that you please speak with our pastor before coming to the Lord's Supper. In practicing close communion, we are not entering into a judgment concerning the faith of individual members of other churches. We rejoice over all those who have saving faith in Jesus Christ. Fellowship at this altar is established by sharing in a common confession of faith, anchored in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We sincerely want all people to receive the Lord's Body and Blood with us, but we want them to receive this sacrament in a way that pleases our Lord. As a steward of God's mysteries, our pastor stands ready to assist you in preparing to come to the Lord's Supper with us by teaching and reviewing God's Word with you. Thank You.

A Note To Our Members: SHOULD YOU COME TO THE LORD'S SUPPER?

- If you feel your faith is weak, you need the Lord's Supper. In it Jesus gives you his body and blood which were given into death for your sins. He wants to strengthen your faith. So come, eat and drink and listen to the words your pastor says to you in the name of Jesus, and believe them with all your heart.
- When you know you've sinned and you feel unworthy. You say you aren't worthy because you aren't good enough. No one else is good enough either. But God doesn't ask whether you are good enough. He only asks, 'Are you sorry for your sins? Do you believe Jesus forgives?' He invites you to come and receive forgiveness through Christ, who shed his blood for you. He makes you sure that forgiveness is yours by giving you Jesus' body and blood to eat and to drink. You believe that, don't you?
- But if you are refusing to give up a particular sin even though you know that God's word forbids it, you are despising God's Word. You are telling God, 'I don't care what you say. I'll do what I want.' Until you repent of your sin, God warns you against abusing this gift. To come to the Lord's Supper will only add to your sin rather than take it away.


- 1) Am I sorry for my sins?

NEXT SUNDAY? Sometimes those who miss church on Sunday neglect to look after their spiritual life privately by reading their Bibles at home and spending time in prayer. They decide that they'll just wait until "next Sunday" to nourish their souls. These same people would never consider such a starvation diet for their bodies, however. If they miss out on a meal at home, they'll be sure to eat out somewhere. So they try to stay on a three-meals-a-day schedule. Anything else would be unthinkable! This indifference toward God's Word creates a problem for the whole congregation. These same people are also often careless about supporting the church and its God-given work. They bring an offering whenever they come to church, but ONLY then. Instead of offering to the LORD a certain portion of their income, they regard the offering somewhat like going to a movie. When you don't go, you don't buy a ticket. They "save" money by not going to church. Others, of course, who are more spiritually alive bring their offerings even when they have to be absent and they are careful to bring their offerings to church in advance of their absence so that the LORD's work may continue as it should. Our spiritual life is directly proportioned to the use we make of God's Word and Sacrament, for the Holy Spirit uses these means to keep and strengthen faith in our hearts. Our offerings reflect our attitude toward God and His Word. All of us need improvement spiritually, and we can grow in faith and godliness only by constant use of Scripture. If we really desire to keep our faith and strengthen it we won't wait until "next Sunday" for our spiritual nourishment when we have to be absent, but will worship privately to make up for what we have missed. A blessed result will be greater diligence in church attendance and in our support of the Church's work. - Selected
