CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION







WHO'S READY TO START THINKING CAMP?!?

Due to the fact that we have been reaching capacity for our ILC Youth Camp, we are going to try something new. Instead of one camp session, we will be running two youth camp sessions. The dates for both camps have been set. Be sure to mark your calendars, the first camp session will run June 21-27 and the second session will run July 19-25. How is this going to work? Each camp session will have a maximum capacity of 80 campers per session. This means we will have a smaller number of campers per camp, but will allow us to be able to take more campers between the two camp sessions. Since we are doing this to make sure no camper is left behind, we will only allow you to register for one camp session. How will I make sure I end up in the camp session with my buddies? We're leaving that up to you. Start thinking, planning, calling, emailing, texting now to figure out when is the best session for you, your family, and your buddies. While we would love to be able to have everyone together, due to the nature of this undertaking, we will not be able to switch campers around after registration. Of course, in an emergency situation we would do our best to make something work. So, how do you register? Registration will open on March 13th. When you register your camper(s) you will have the choice to pick which camp (June 21-27 or July 19-25) your camper(s) will attend. However, once one of the dates fill up you will only be able to attend the other date. So, make sure you know what dates you want to register for before registration begins! Since this is something new to our staff, we know there is going to be some trial-and-error along the way, so please bear with us as we work on this new undertaking! Here the words Zion, Israel, and Jerusalem, are all names for God's Holy Church – you and me and all believers of all time.
