The Combined Obituaries of Gordon and Velma Diehl

Velma Mae Diehl was born April 9, 1920, God's gift to Les and Ruby Grimm of Orofino. She was the third of seven children, the only girl. Which meant she had to wear a lot of pink dresses, which of course earned her the endearing nickname "Pinky." Velma graduated from Lewiston High School and then went to business college to learn bookkeeping. Early on she married Russell Dodson who died in 1943 while in the service. She then married Art Woodruff, who also died. Then in 1960 the LORD blessed her with another gift in Holy Matrimony. But more about that in a minute...

Gordon Abraham Diehl was born on February 12, 1922, in Huron, ND, God's gift to Oscar and Emma Diehl. Because of the dust bowl conditions in the Dakotas, the family was forced to move and they traveled to Dixie and Walla Walla, WA. From there to Lewiston area and Orofino.

The Bible says in **Proverbs 18:24:** "He who finds a wife finds a good thing, And obtains favor from the LORD." The LORD had a great gift in mind for these two when He brought them together in the Holy Estate of Matrimony on February 17th, 1960. The Almighty blessed them with over 50 years of life and love together.

Throughout their lives, the LORD continued to provide for their earthly needs in various ways.

Gordon and Velma had several professions. Gordon loved working with wood! Velma often said "Gordon had pitch in his veins, not blood." He worked as a Sauer, a college math professor, a butcher and a policeman. The story is told of how he even once gave the mayor of Orofino a parking ticket.

Velma worked as a bookkeeper for Grey – Web Buick, and Owl Drug. She and Gordon worked together in their later lives and opened "Clearwater Saw-Shop" in Pierce, ID. Velma, of course, did the books. Gordon supplied wood for many family members, neighbors and also for his pastor's residence. Velma was confirmed in the Lutheran faith on Nov. 27th, 1980, and Gordon followed suite in 1981 at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Lewiston, ID., the Rev. Riedel – a vacancy pastor from Spokane Valley officiating.

Gordon and Velma were members here at St. John's Ev. Lutheran Church in Clarkston. Through the years the Good Shepherd fed them with the green pastures of His powerful Word as well as the nourishing forgiveness of sins found in the real presence of His body and blood under the bread and wine of Holy Communion. Gordon served as the Treasurer for a number of years, and Velma enjoyed participating in the many duties of the Ladies Aid group.
