



C: How excellent is Your name in all the earth!





THE BIBLE LESSONS

God speaks to us.

The Old Testament Reading:

Deuteronomy 11:18-21, 26-28 "Therefore you shall lay up these words of mine in your heart and in your soul, and bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. 19 "You shall teach them to your children, speaking of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up. 20 "And you shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates, 21 "that your days and the days of your children may be multiplied in the land of which the LORD swore to your fathers to give them, like the days of the heavens above the earth. 26 "Behold, I set before you today a blessing and a curse: 27 "the blessing, if you obey the commandments of the LORD your God which I command you today; 28 "and the curse, if you do not obey the commandments of the LORD your God, but turn aside from the way which I command you today, to go after other gods which you have not known.

PASTOR Here ends the Old Testament Reading. We continue with the responsive reading of:

PASTOR The New Testament Reading comes from Matthew chapter 7, beginning there in the 21st verse.




The New Testament Reading

Matthew 7:21-29 "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven. 22 "Many will say to Me in that day, 'Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?' 23 "And then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!' 24 "Therefore whoever hears these sayings of Mine, and does them, I will liken him to a wise man who built his house on the rock: 25 "and the rain descended, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house; and it did not fall, for it was founded on the rock. 26 "But everyone who hears these sayings of Mine, and does not do them, will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand: 27 "and the rain descended, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house; and it fell. And great was its fall." 28 And so it was, when Jesus had ended these sayings, that the people were astonished at His teaching, 29 for He taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes.

THE SERMON

Pre- Sermon Vocabulary:

- Righteousness: "The perfect keeping of God's Holy Law. One sin enters in and you have unrighteousness across the board."
- ◆ Sin: "Breaking God's Law"
- Grace: "God's undeserved love. The total work of God whereby He saves sinners.
 God's Riches At Christ's Expense."
- Justification: "Declared not guilty. Think of a courtroom setting: God is the Judge. You are the guilty criminal awaiting the death sentence. God bangs His gavel and DECLARES YOU NOT GUILTY. How can this be? Through the shed blood of His Son and our Savior Jesus Christ!"
- Objective Justification: "God through Christ declared all sinners as righteous: nothing in us or of us. It's basis is solely and alone Christ's perfect obedience, suffering and death."
- Subjective Justification: "You have faith (which God gave you) and this faith believes. This is the individual's own subjective faith."
- ◆ Justifying Faith: "The hand which God creates and into which He places the forgiveness of sins. There is no greater or lesser Justifying Faith. Nothing proceeds Justification in the work of the Holy Spirit."
- Redemption, from redeem: "To buy back."
- Propitiation: "Satisfactory payment."

Romans 3:21-25a, 27-28 But now the righteousness of God apart from the law is revealed, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets (the Bible), 22 even the righteousness of God, through faith in Jesus Christ, to all and on all who believe. For there is no difference; 23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, 24 being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, 25 whom God set forth as a propitiation by His blood, through faith, to demonstrate His righteousness, 27 Where is boasting then? It is excluded. By what law? Of works? No, but by the law of faith. 28 Therefore we conclude that a man is justified by faith apart from the deeds of the law.
