All my acquaintances watched for my stumbling, *saying*, "Perhaps he can be induced; Then we will prevail against him, And we will take our revenge on him." ¹¹ But the LORD *is* with me as a mighty, awesome One. Therefore my persecutors will stumble, and will not prevail. P: No, it is You, O LORD our God. Therefore our hope is in You,




Pastor: The Gospel Reading is Matthew 10 beginning in the 24th verse.

If they have called the master of the house Beelzebub, how much more *will they call* those of his household! ²⁶ "Therefore do not fear them. For there is nothing covered that will not be revealed, and hidden that will not be known. ²⁷ "Whatever I tell you in the dark, speak in the light; and what you hear in the ear, preach on the housetops. ²⁸ "And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. But rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell. ²⁹ "Are not two sparrows sold for a copper coin?
